Volunteer Services

J.A.I.L. Ministry has 2 separate volunteer applications. One is for the Bell County Law Enforcement Center adult facility and one is for the Juvenile Services Center juvenile facility. A background check is done for an individual before they are allowed to participate in the program. Once approved, volunteers are plugged into various aspects of the program.

- 1 We utilize volunteers inside the jail(s) and inside the juvenile center to facilitate Bible studies.
- 2 Volunteers also visit with inmates that request a one-on-one visit. This is done over the visitation monitors that families use to visit their loved ones who are incarcerated. There is a mentoring program one-on-one for the juveniles.
- 3 Volunteers help inside the J.A.I.L Ministry offices on Tuesday and Friday each week processing inmate service requests, prayer requests, and request for Bible and Christian reading materials, Write Way and Crossroad correspondence courses, Child Evangelism Fellowship Mailbox Club and prayer requests.
- 4 Volunteers serve on the J.A.I.L. Ministry Golf Committee. Each April we hold the Harold Ellis Memorial Golf Tournament. Harold was the original founder of J.A I.L Ministry, Inc.
- 5 Volunteers serve on the J.A.I.L. Ministry Banquet Committee. The banquet is held each October, and allows businesses, church and mission groups, along with families and individuals an opportunity to partner with us in the ministry.
- 6 Volunteers serve on the Project Angel Tree Committee. J.A.I.L. Ministry participates with Prison Fellowship to provide children of inmates 3 gifts each at Christmas. These same volunteers also facilitate a Christmas party and provide gifts for the Bell County Correctional Officers children.
- 7 Volunteers across Central Texas are “Prayer Partners” with and for the ministry. It is not necessary for these to complete a background check.
